OUR FRANCHISE, or Permit which is known as Ordinance No. 961 is nothing more than a legal permit or license for your Electric Company to use the streets, alleys and public places for poles and other installations necessary to furnish electric service.

MANY BUSINESSES AND PERSONS OPERATE UNDER PERMITS . . . Banks, for instance, are chartered by National or State Government. Insurance companies and corporations are chartered by State Boards. Hotels, motels, restaurants and many other businesses operate under a license or permit issued by State or City.

UTILITY PERMITS usually run for a definite number of years, but not always:

In Wisconsin . . . no time limit; they are indefinite.

In Illinois	99	years	In Texas	50	years
In Nebraska	25	years	In South Dakota	20	years

ELECTRIC UTILITIES IN SOUTH DAKOTA get their license by vote of the people of the municipality in which they operate. It is not exclusive because South Dakota law prohibits exclusive franchises.

IN THE CASE OF YOUR ELECTRIC COMPANY... The permit is contained in Ordinance No. 961. Your City Commission has passed and adopted the Ordinance. The Ordinance must be approved by a majority of the electors of Aberdeen voting thereon at a Special Election to be held September 12, 1961. This is the procedure under South Dakota law.

Entire NWPS Electric System Is Located In South Dakota




Northwestern Public Service Company's 1960 Property Tax Bill In Aberdeen Is \$232,324.89

In 1926 _____ was 10c In 1961 _____ is 2.7c



An Interconnected System Is Insurance For You

You will notice on the map in the center of this booklet that all communities served electrically by Northwestern Public Service Company are connected by transmission lines. This is an interconnected system and it provides insurance for more reliable electric service for you.

Being part of an interconnected system means, for example, that electricity generated at Huron or Mitchell or Yankton, or in any one of Northwestern's plants, can be used here in Aberdeen. NWPS presently is operating 10 electric generating plants, including the big steam plant here in Aberdeen.

River Power Savings For You From NWPS

Northwestern Public Service Company has a contract with the Federal Government for the purchase of Missouri River power. Savings that are realized from the use of river power are PASSED ON TO OUR CUSTOMERS. Our contract with the Federal Government requires that such savings be passed on to our customers.

Since first receiving river power late in 1954, Northwestern has passed on \$1,377,200 in savings to its customers.

This has been and will continue to be the policy of Northwestern Public Service Company. Savings realized from the use of this power WILL CONTINUE TO BE PASSED ON TO YOU. It will continue to be our policy to give our customers the benefit of savings that can be developed through the purchase of Missouri River power.

REPRINT OF ORDINANCE NUMBER 961 AS APPROVED BY THE ABERDEEN CITY COMMISSION ON JULY 17, 1961 AND PUBLISHED IN THE ABERDEEN AMERICAN NEWS ON JULY 21, 1961.

This is only a PERMIT to use Streets and Alleys for Poles and Wires to deliver Electricity

Section 1. Grants only the right to use streets and alleys - and provides that the right granted SHALL NOT BE EX-CLUSIVE.

Section 2. Provides for people to vote on the ordinance.

Section 3. Makes the Company subject to all ordinances of Aberdeen covering the use of streets, alleys and public places and to the exercise of the police powers of the City.

Section 4. Makes the Company liable for all damages and relieves and saves the City from damages arising from the operation of the Company's system.

Section 5. This or dinance shall not be effective unless approved by a majority of the electors voting.

961 TO ORDINANCE NO. 961 AN ORDINANCE GRANTING TO NORTH-WESTERN PUBLIC SERVICE COMPANY, ITS SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS, THE RIGHT TO OCCUPY ANY OF THE STREETS, ALLEYS OR PUBLIC PLACES OF THE CITY OF ABER-DEEN, SOUTH DAKOTA, FOR THE PURPOSE OF TRANSMITTING OR DISTRIBUTING ELEC-TRICITY, AND PROVIDING FOR AN ELECT-ION THEREON. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF ABER-DEEN, SOUTH DAKOTA:

Section 1. The right is hereby granted to Northwestern Public Service Company, its successors and assigns, to occupy any of the streets, alleys or public places of the City of Aberdeen, South Dakota, for the purpose of transmitting or distributing electricity for a period of twenty (20) years from the 5th day of September, 1961, provided, however, that the right herein granted shall not be exclusive.

Section 2. The proposition of whether or not said right shall be granted shall be sub-mitted to a vote of the electors of this muni-cipality at a special election called for that purpose not sooner than thirty days after the publication of this ordinance.

Section 3. That in the construction, main-tenance, repair, and operation of its electric system and in the use of the streets, alleys, and other public places in said City, the said company shall at all times be subject to and comply with all ordinances, rules, and regu-lations of said city now or hereafter in force covering the use of streets, alleys, and public places, or covering excavation in or under any such streets, alleys, or public places; and the rights herein granted are subject to the exer-cise of the police power as the same now is or may hereafter be conferred upon said city. Failure on the part of said company to file its acceptance hereof with the City Auditor as herein provided or to comply with any of the provisions of this ordinance shall render this ordinance and the franchise and privileges granted hereunder subject to cancellation.

Section 4. The grantee shall be liable for all damages due to its negligence in constructing, operating or maintaining its electric system within the said municipality, and shall at all times save the said municipality harmless from any and all liability arising out of negli-gence of the grantee.

Section 5. The ordinance shall not be effec-tive unless the proposal to grant said right be approved at such election by a majority vote of the electors of this municipality voting thereon; and unless said Company shall file its unconditional acceptance of this Ordinance with the City Auditor of said City within twenty (20) days after the official canvass of the votes of the electors approving said Or-dinance.

(Special Election) OF ABERDEEN SOUTH DAKOTA September 12, 1961

QUESTION SUBMITTED

Do the Electors of the City of Aberdeen, Brown County, South Dakota, approve Ordinance No. 931 granting to Northwestern Public Service Company, its successors and assigns, the right to occupy any of the streets, alleys or public places of the City of Aberdeen, South Dakota, for the purpose of transmitting or distributing electricity, as specifically provided in Ordinance No. 931 as now on file in the office of the City Auditor of said City of Aberdeen, South Dakota, and which Ordinance was heretofore duly adopted by the governing body of said City, and published in full and the full title of which Ordinance is as follows:

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING TO NORTHWESTERN PUBLIC SERVICE COMPANY, ITS SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS, THE RIGHT TO OCCUPY ANY OF THE STREETS, ALLEYS OR PUBLIC PLACES OF THE CITY OF ABERDEEN, SOUTH DAKOTA, FOR THE PURPOSE OF TRANSMITTING OR DISTRIBUTING ELECTRICITY, AND PROVIDNG FOR AN ELECTION THEREON.
